Fort Wayne Radio Club Auction



The annual Fort Wayne Radio Club auction will be held on Friday January 15, 2010. You may bring your items to the auction as early as 6:00 PM, and the auction will start at 6:30 PM sharp. The auction will conclude before 9:00 PM.

If you are planning to auction a high dollar value item, you may wish to place a message on the FWRC Yahoo group http://groups.yahoo.com/group/FWRC. Messages will be visible to group members

only.

In order to improve the auction experience for attendees and club officers, we suggest the following rules and procedures:

- 1 Anyone selling or potentially buying equipment will be required to sign in and obtain an auction participant number.
- 2 In order to encourage items of significant value at the auction, the club will limit its 10% fee (paid by the seller) to the first \$200 of value on each item. Thus, any item auctioned for over \$200 will have a club fee of only \$20.
- 3 For auction participants who make large purchases and need to pay by personal check, the club will accept checks from year 2010 members or year 2009 members for amounts under \$500. Any checks from non-members or for values of \$500 or over will REQUIRE a government-issued photo ID (such as a driver-s license) issued to the person signing the check.

- 4 We are suggesting that the seller be prepared to offer a brief description of their items as the auctioneer presents them for auction.
- 5 This year the club will keep track of only the items that are successfully auctioned. No advance preparation other than identifying the auction items you own is needed. The club tracks the seller ID number, the item final auction value, and the buyer ID number. The club will use Post-it® notes to mark and record sold items for the 2008 auction. This should help control the record keeping. Only sold items will be tagged identifying the seller and buyer.
- 6 Please be patient with the treasurer when the auction is over. We hope this change in record-keeping will decrease the check-out time when the auction is over. We always suggest you keep track of your purchases and sales (rather than depending on the club records) to eliminate any "What-- Oh My Gosh" factor at the end of the auction. We prefer that sellers allow buyers to pay up and make sure all records are straight before checking out and leaving the auction. Each participant will pay for all items they have purchased and will be paid for all items they have sold less the club 10% fee (up to \$20 maximum fee per item).

width, or whatever; bring your rig to the February general meeting and we will have the technical experts and the equipment to check it out.



Fort Wayne Radio Club Meeting Minutes - 18 December 2009



The December meeting of the Fort Wayne Radio Club was held at the Good Shepherd United Methodist Church on 18 December 2009.

The meeting drew about 50 attendees, was hosted by President Tom Baker, and featured the annual club Christmas banquet. But before the banquet festivities commenced, a brief business meeting was conducted in order to take a vote on the proposed purchase of a new antenna and subsequent tower climbing expenses required to replace the 146.910 MHz antenna at Robison Park.

The antenna replacement cost is expected to be about \$1,400.00 based upon material and tower climbing quotes obtained over the past year. The club had raised about \$1,900.00 towards replacement of the antenna based upon donations and matching funds from the club treasury.

The proposal to replace the antenna was formally put forward, seconded and voted in the affirmative by the members present. Hence the antenna will be put on order and the tower climber engaged as soon as practicable.



A Visit to the Pescara Electronics Fair - Carl Luetzelschwab K9LA

In the December Allen County HamNews, I mentioned that my wife Vicky AE9YL and I went to the Pescara (Italy) electronics fair to do DXCC

card checking for the ARRL (I was covering for Dan N1ND since he was scheduled to go but had to back out a couple weeks earlier). It was such an interesting experience that I thought I'd give a short narration of our trip.

We left Wednesday morning before Thanksgiving. Because we made our flight reservations relatively late, we had a three-leg journey to Italy: from Ft Wayne to Detroit, then Detroit to Atlanta, and finally Atlanta to Rome. Even though we had some tight connection times, all went well and we landed in Rome around 7 AM Thursday morning. We found the bus station at the airport, and enjoyed a very scenic two and a half hour ride from Rome to the coastal city of Pescara on the Adriatic Sea on the east side of Italy.

We were met at the Pescara bus station by Valeriano IZ6OXU. He immediately took us to the convention center, where we had a great pasta lunch with a couple other ARI (the Italian equivalent of the ARRL) personnel. After lunch Valeriano took us to our hotel, and said to be in the lobby around 8 PM for dinner. We checked in, and took a short nap.

We headed down to the lobby just before 8 PM, and soon were introduced to Valentina. Her dad is Valerio IK6BLG, her mom is Marina IW6PQI, and her brother is Mario IW6PVN. Valentina will soon have her license to make it an all-ham family. Valentina is in her late twenties, and spoke great English (although with a heavy Italian accent). We went to dinner Friday evening with a large crowd of ARI people (the presidents of the twenty ARI regions of Italy), including Mario I2MQP (the other DXCC card checker besides me). We had a multi-course meal at a local seafood restaurant on the Adriatic. It was fabulous several different courses of pasta followed by several different courses of seafood. We left the restaurant around 11:30 PM, stuffed to the gills.

Friday was devoted to sightseeing around the Pescara area with Valentina and her mom Marina. Marina spoke limited English, but she was trying hard to pick up our language. Friday night ended with an-

other great dinner at a local hotel.

The fair opened at 9:00 AM Saturday morning, with several long lines waiting to buy tickets to get in. The convention center was about the size of the area in the Coliseum for the Ft Wayne hamfest, and the estimated attendance was 20,000. Yes, it was very crowded. DXCC card checking kept Mario and me busy until 4:00 PM, when it finally tapered off. The Saturday night dinner, again with ARI personnel, was at the restaurant area in the convention center, and included more pasta and scrumptious lamb meat on skewers.

Sunday appeared to be as crowded as Saturday, but the card checking activity was much lighter. That gave us an opportunity to walk around the fair. We also visited Valentina's booth, where Vicky bought some items. We ended up doing 51 DXCC applications, which Mario reported as being up a bit from last year. We called it quits at 1 PM on Sunday, and Vicky and I said our goodbyes and hopped on a bus back to Rome for our Monday morning flight home.

In summary, we had a great time at the Pescara electronics fair. And we consider ourselves fortunate to have gone in Dan N1ND's place.

Severe Weather Notes

2009 turned out to be one of the quietest severe weather seasons in years, but now it's time to turn our attention to the new year. The training sessions for Allen County will be held Tuesday March 16th at 2:00 and 7:00 p.m. at the public safety academy (note this is in March and not February as in previous years).

Early last year, several offices in the NWS Central Region - including Northern Indiana - experimented with changing the minimum hail size for a severe thunderstorm warning to one inch. Due to the favorable response from the public, the change is going to be permanent and implemented nationwide.

Since this is an even-numbered year, we will not have an advanced training session in this area. However, the Indianapolis NWS office will be co-sponsoring an advanced session on Saturday, March 13th. The \$35 cost includes both breakfast and lunch buffets. At press time the final list of speakers had not been posted; however, one of the confirmed speakers is Chris Novy who has spoken at several of our advanced sessions.
