

147.255 Repeater Back On The Air


In case you have not heard yet, the 147.255 repeater is back on the air and sounds great.

CQ Contest from Zulu Fox One Alpha

With Cycle 24 picking up, I figured it was time to give the ARRL 10m Contest a try from a more southerly location for

improved propagation (compared to Ft Wayne). Anyway, if propagation wasn't good down there, my wife Vicky AE9YL and I could always enjoy warm temperatures, blue water, sunny skies, and white sand beaches.

We left Ft Wayne bright and early Thursday morning before the contest on the 6:00 AM Delta flight to Atlanta. We landed on Grand Cayman around 1:00 PM, picked up the rental car, and quickly settled into our accommodations.

We operated from the Cayman Amateur Radio Society (CARS) station located on ZF1EJ's property. Joe W6VNR/ZF2AH, Vicky (ZF2YL), and I (ZF2LA) entered the high power multiop single transmitter category. We had three antennas available for 10m, which allowed us to point them in three different directions and switch instantly between them. I also brought my mini-laptop

and used it for PacketCluster spots. We used the club station call sign ZF1A.

Vicky and I were at the station Friday evening when the contest started at 7:00 PM local time. We worked 91 stations up to 10:41 PM local time before heading back to the hotel.

Joe started operating Saturday morning. He arrived at the station around sunrise to catch the beginning of any European opening. But nothing happened to Europe (as expected). He did work a handful of North American stations. But then the propagation switch turned ON just before 10:00 AM. Stateside QSOs, especially to the close-in southeastern states, were exceptional in number and signal strength due to sporadic E.

Vicky relieved Joe a little later in the morning, and as expected her female voice attached to the ZF1A call attracted a big crowd. It was mostly short-skip to the US, but they all counted. Vicky and I alternated at the radio every couple hours (I caught up on e-mail when she operated, and she read when I operated). When we quit around 8:30 PM Saturday night, we had just over 1100 QSOs in the log. We looked forward to (and hoped for) similar propagation on Sunday.

Unfortunately Sunday was as bad as Saturday was

good. We didn't have any long-duration sporadic E - just short openings that produced weak signals. We mostly searched and pounced on Sunday. Joe did get one good short run to the US in the early afternoon. We did have many strong South American stations via trans-equatorial F2 propagation in the late afternoon. I also had a short run of VK/ZL stations later in the afternoon. We didn't hear a single JA.

We ended up with just over 1400 QSOs at the end of the contest, so Sunday only produced about one fourth of what Saturday did. Our consolation is that next year should be even better as long as Cycle 24 continues its ascent. We don't if we'll head

back down there next year, but it's nice to dream about doing it again.

Finally, Monday evening was the annual CARS Christmas dinner, and Joe, Vicky, and I attended this event. Vicky and I met many of the resident ZF hams (Joe already knew most of them as he spends much time on ZF). We ate well, enjoyed the company, and had a great time.
