Jim, KB9IH, said that he is working with the Coliseum as to what to use for the third meeting room as the Blue Room is no longer in existence.


No other business was discussed.

An Impromptu Meeting of the Lafayette DX Association

On Saturday July 18 the Lafayette DX Association (LDXA – Lafayette, IN) held an impromptu meeting at lunch time at the Lafayette Brewing Company. My wife Vicky AE9YL and I attended, along with LDXA members Dave N9FN, Tim N9LF and David K9FN. I card-checked two DXCC applications at the "meeting".

Why was this an impromptu meeting and why were Vicky and I there? The best answer is the number 765. That's the 2-8-4 steam locomotive restored into operational condition by the Fort Wayne Railroad Historical Society. On Saturday July 18 (and again on Sunday July 19), the Historical Society offered roundtrips to Lafayette.

Vicky and I splurged and bought tickets for a dome car (there were two dome cars used on this trip). We had a great view (we were in the front seats of the dome), sitting above the rest of the train. There were 15 passenger cars being pulled, with approximately 700 passengers on board. Our dome car was towards the back of the train.

Three things stood out in my mind. First, I was surprised by how much straight track there was between Fort Wayne and Lafayette. Sure, there were some curves, but most was straight as an arrow.

Second, the ride was very smooth. I grew up in northwest Indiana, and vividly remember the clickedy-clack of the old South Shore commuter train that ran between South Bend and Chicago. When I asked the porter in our car about this, he said nowadays the rails are welded together, not joined together with plates.

Third, steam locomotives attract attention. At every road crossing (and I mean every road crossing – even the ones out in the middle of nowhere), there were cars parked with people watching us pass by. Many had cameras on tripods with telephoto lenses. We saw many drones (quad copters), too. And grandmas and grandpas were there with the grandkids – most of the time the kids were holding their hands over their ears because of the 765's whistle. Being in a dome car gave us a great view of all of this.

At every overpass that we went under, the same thing happened – people were lined up on the bridge shooting pictures and waving. And we had an entourage (these were not railroad people – these were railroad aficionados). With US 24 and US 25

paralleling the tracks in many spots, we'd see upwards of twenty cars pacing us and taking pictures - we'd see the same cars multiple times when US 24 or US 25 was again close to the tracks.

Norfolk Southern yard on the east side of Lafayette. Dave N9FN and his girlfriend Sylvia picked us up there and the LDXA meeting then convened in downtown Lafayette. I did operate on 2m as K9LA/mobile on the Wabash Cannonball – so radio was used on this trip!





THE FOXHUNT CHRONICLES

The August foxhunt occurred on 2 August on a beautiful, sunny, non-monsoony (for a change) day. Two hunter teams were available for this contest. The first team consisted of Jim & Annie Pliett, K9OMA & KA9YYI, plus Carole & Al Burke, WB9's RUS & SSE. The second team consisted of Charles Ward, KC9MUT, Fred Gengnagel, KC9EZP and Robert Dean, KC9UHU. Both teams awaited the 146.430 MHz emissions from the fox at their starting point of Cobin Memorial Park.

Jim & Kim Machamer, KB9's DOS & DOT served as the fox. Their high power fox consisted of a mobile rig driving a yagi, and they were located where the southern segment of Young Rd. abuts I-469. They placed the micro-fox up against the chain link fence that runs parallel to the west-bound lane of 1469 where the northern segment of Young Rd. abuts I-469. I-469 bisects Young Rd, and there is no overpass or underpass that allows one to get from the north to the south segment of (the bisected) Young Rd. directly. In other words Jim & Kim were sitting in their van on Young Rd. just to the south of I-469 and could look across I-469 to the southern segment of Young Rd., and to where the microfox was located. Sorta sneaky.

The microfox itself was one of the microprocessor controlled units that emits about 20 milli-watts of cw every 2½ minutes. It was well camouflaged with some pine tree branches wrapped around it, and turned out to be very hard to see. More on that later.

2015 Foxhunt Schedule

The following is the planned Foxhunt schedule for 2015. All foxhunts start at 1:30 PM on Sunday. The starting location will be the River Greenway Trailhead (Cobin Memorial Park) near the Lakeside Golf Course:

September 13 October 4 November 1



The fox came up at the appointed time (13:30) and both hunter teams immediately heard it bleeping out to the northnortheast. So off we went. Pretty soon the two hunting teams became separated, and ours proceeded north up Maplecrest until we hit Rothman Rd. where we turned east for a bit, and then turned back north again on Young Rd, following our DF bearings. At the terminus of Young Rd. on the south side of I-469, about thirty minutes into the hunt, we found Jim & Kim ensconced in their van doing their high power fox thing. So we got our hand-held gear out and started hunting on foot. The microfox's fundamental signal was guite strong, but I heard nothing on the third harmonic. We could look across I-469 and see where the bisected Young Rd. started again. Pretty soon it became obvious to us that those tricky Machamer's had stashed the microfox across the Interstate. So we got back in Jim's vehicle and backtracked to Maplecrest, crossed under I-469 and proceeded east on Flutter Rd. That's where we saw the Ward, Gengnagel, Dean team's vehicle also ripping east on Flutter. We said "Oh shucks" (yah, really), "they beat us again". But they didn't turn south down Young Rd. but kept going east. Since we knew the microfox just about had to be on the north section of Young Rd., and close to I-469, we turned down Young Rd. and stopped where it ran into I-469. Once we got back on foot I started hearing the third harmonic which pointed directly at the fence that defines the right-of-way of the interstate. The third harmonic led me directly to the microfox. I knew it had to be there in the weeds up against the fence, but I couldn't see it because of the camouflage job Jim & Kim did on the thing.

But at forty-one minutes into the hunt, after a little thrashing around in the undergrowth I finally found the thing. (Thank goodness we do not hunt in rattle-snake or Gila-Monster territory).

Now, not to be out-done by Jim & Kim's craftiness, and since we realized that Charles and crew were not yet sure on which side of I-469 the microfox was located, we drove back to Jim & Kim's location and got on foot again "hunting" for the fox. Sure enough, Charles and crew showed up and proceeded hunting on foot too. But after a bit they too realized that the microfox was across the interstate and proceeded back across it, down Young Rd., and eventually found the microfox about sixty-two minutes into the



hunt.

Following the contest everyone buzzed over to the Dairy Queen on Maplecrest and Rothman Rd. and partook of their offerings. It was gooood.

Given the Pliett-Burke team won this one, they will serve as the fox for the September hunt which is scheduled to occur on Sunday, 13 September. The fox will radiate on 146.160 MHz with the intercom on 146.910 MHz.


